

LOON ON THE LAKE

Loon on the Lake is a "paperless" paper piecing project which means it's constructed using freezer paper and sewed so that you never have to rip out all those tiny pieces of paper when you are finished. Once you have sewed the sections you simply pull off the freezer paper which can be used over and over again so no need to make multiple copies of your pattern.

Supply List:

Pattern: Teacher will provide the pattern. Cost will be determined as soon as I hear back from the designer. It will be in the \$5-\$10 range.

Teacher will also provide the freezer paper pattern included in the above fee.

You will need:

Sewing machine and neutral thread

Small cutting mat

Small iron and ironing surface which can be placed next to your machine

Add-a-quarter ruler. If you need to buy one, the 6" ruler is fine.

Scissors

Small rotary ruler (about 3" x 12" is fine). A large one will be awkward

Rotary cutter

This lovely little loon is only 7 x 7" finished (before border) so you don't need much fabric.

About a fat eighth for the sky -

About a fat eighth for the water

1/8 yard for the border

About 6"x6" pieces are fine for everything else. It's always good to have a little extra for you "oops" pile.

Solid black - head

Solid white or small print - chest

Black & white stripe - neck (or whatever looks good to you)

Two different black prints for the body

Dark green - leaves

Light green - leaves

For the eye you can embroider a French knot of an amber color or I will have beads you can use.
